### From Romans 6

The Apostle Paul helps us understand that after Jesus saves us, we are *dead to sin*, meaning sin no longer has <u>the</u> <u>control over us</u> it once had. Now the life we live for God is characterized by the removal of old, <u>sinful</u> practices, and the addition of new, <u>Jesus-</u> *like* virtues.

#### Putting on Forgiveness

- 1. Repent of <u>unforgiveness</u>.
- 2. Ask Jesus to <u>supernaturally</u> replace your unforgiveness with forgiveness.
- 3. Pursue forgiveness this week.
  - Wake up, <u>thanking God</u> for forgiving your sins.
  - Recognize the <u>weakness of</u> <u>man</u>.
  - When someone offends you <u>overlook it</u> without comment.
  - Don't surrender <u>common</u> <u>courtesy</u>.
  - Determine to <u>not ever, ever</u> bring up again a certain wrong you've obsessed over.
    - Trust in the <u>sovereignty of</u> <u>God</u>.
